Introduction

In the academic year 2017-18 we received £18,500. The money has been spent to fulfil the following grant conditions, additional money was invested by school to supplement our sports premium.

1. The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity.
2. The profile of PE and sport raised across the school as a tool for whole school improvement.
3. Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.
4. Broader experience of a range of sports and activities offered to all pupils.
5. Increasing participation in competitive sport.

REEVO Coaching SLA	<p>Entering the REEVO Coaching SLA provided all of our children with excellent PE provision. Highly qualified coaches supported the subject leader and class teachers in delivering exciting lessons which promoted active lifestyles. Those pupils in EYFS had sessions from an early year's specialist who helped develop core movement as well as sports fundamentals which are a precursor to more advanced, sports specific, skills.</p> <p>Breakfast clubs and dance clubs organized throughout the year which children were able to access. REEVO provided support for developing teachers' knowledge of delivering games sessions in addition to providing children with outstanding provision.</p> <p>Additionally, REEVO provided our school with an extensive extracurricular programme which targeted all pupil groups across the year. Employment of specialist PE teacher	<p>After success last year former head teacher with sporting links across the region and a background in sports coaching was again employed on a part-time basis to raise the quality of teaching and learning. His role was to team teach or lead PE lessons and clubs in school alongside teaching staff as part of their CPD.</p> <p>In addition, the teacher worked alongside our PE apprentice in a mentoring role to help deliver outstanding PE provision. The specialist aided new teachers in planning and assessment including supporting SEND and identification of gifted and talented pupils. Opportunities for all pupils were provided through lunchtime and after-school clubs to develop healthy and active lifestyles. There has been a drive on getting more girls involved in competitive sports this year in these settings.</p> <p>The teacher also supported the school in organising level 1 competitions and prepared children for level 2 and 3 competitions in the School Games, Derwentside District and Durham County events.</p>	Our PE apprentice was able to successfully lead on PE sessions across the school and will continue this development in the coming year. Subsidise the employment of a PE apprentice (2nd Year)	<p>Apprentice used across school to support curriculum PE, School Sport and promoting healthy lifestyles.</p> <p>The PE apprentice has continued to support PE lessons for teachers who received CPD from specialists last year. The apprentice provided support so that the quality of teaching and learning in PE was at least 'Good'. Teachers have benefitted from the extra support in PE lessons as they were able to plan, execute and evaluate high quality PE sessions.</p> <p>Finally, the apprentice supported the PE lead with the administration demands associated with organising level 1 and 2 competitions at the same time as delivering an extensive after school sports programme.</p>	Apprentice trained pupils as 'Sports Leaders' enabling them to build on their existing skills by exploring more leadership opportunities in the next academic year – in both PE sessions and playtimes e.g. organising intra-school tournaments.	Increased quality of PE lessons and graded by external and internal validators to support this. Added opportunity to all children to participate in active breakfast club and lunch time clubs. Futsal coach delivering 'early movement' scheme to pupils	<p>As part of the 'Futsal Partnership' pupils from EYFS took part in an 8 week 'early movement' course focused on creating a foundation of basic skills which pupils will take into their later sporting lives.</p> <p>Pupils initially played games which focused on core movement and coordination manifested in simple low access high outcome games. Once pupils were familiar with the games and skills they were then given some 'free play' guided by the Futsal team where they have the opportunity to apply the skills gained previously. Eventually, the pupils were challenged to create their own simple games based on those previously experienced to give them ownership of the sessions.</p>	Pupils in EYFS build both their skills in sport but also a confidence to lead and make their own games with a view to becoming a 'Sports Leader' in the future.	<p>Quality of basic skills in EYFS was clear and the children really looked forward to the futsal sessions and subsequent PE sessions.</p> <p>Pupils were also able to set up their own simple games during PE sessions but also on the yard – with some adult supervision.</p>	1, 2 & 3	£600

<p>Subsidy of extra-curricular sporting trips or experiences</p>	<p>As a reward for hard work and attitude in PE and school sport, pupils from across school took part in a 'match day' experience with both Newcastle United and Newcastle Eagles Basketball Club allowing them to gain an insight into elite team performance. Some pupils also visited The Hobson Golf Club for weekly sessions with the club pro.</p>	<p>A longer term link with Newcastle United has been made with their football in the community service. Staff from NUFC will deliver sporting and education sessions in school.</p>	<p>Engagement in football widened even further with more girls and pupils who wouldn't normally play in a team or structured event.</p> <p>School council had a request from several pupils for the school to invest in basketball equipment several of our pupils have started playing during break time with the guidance of the sports apprentice.</p> <p>Pupil engagement in the tri-golf competitions has increase and the school are looking to invest further in the appropriate equipment to facilitate this in 2018-19.</p>	<p>2, 4 & 5</p>	<p>£1,500</p>
